Rajitha Menon is freelance consultant. She currently teaches at the University of Essex, where she is also a research assistant in Sociology, She has also taught at the department of sociology, Delhi School of Economics. For her doctoral work, she studied sex work in Mumbai. She was awarded a Commonwealth Scholarship for her doctoral studies to study the social determinants of health at Oxford University's Department of International Development. She did her post-doctoral work on health policy and development at Harvard University's Department of Global Health and Population (2012-2014). Rajitha is currently teaching Development Studies in Indian universities such as JNU and Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI). She is a member of the editorial board of "Development and Change" and a reviewer for the Journal of Development Studies. Rajitha has been awarded three fellowships for her work including an SSHRC fellowship in 2003, International Development Data Forum fellowship in 2004-2005, and by the Women's Media Centre in 2010. She has also served on India's National Committee on Population Policy (2011-2014), which supported the country's new population policy paper. She is also currently serving on three international organizations including UNFPA Governing Body in 2018-2020, United Nations Population Fund, UN Women Council Member in 2018-2021, and Indian National Committee on Population Science. Rajitha has been involved in national and international policy work on family planning and population for over 15 years. She has written and spoken extensively on topics such as the government's new population policy, contemporary reproductive health, the importance of sexuality education in promoting positive sexualities worldwide. . *In 2004 Rajitha Menon won a national level scholarship from the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) for her PhD work 'Sex Work In Mumbai'. The research was completed under Professor Judith Brown at University of Oxford. Her doctoral thesis was awarded a Commonwealth Scholarship to undertake further work under Professor Lawrence Haddad at Sussex University. She went on to post-doctoral work at Harvard University under Professor Subhrendu Pattanayak. *In 2013 Rajitha was awarded the ACMUR International Award for her work on sexuality and HIV and rights and human rights and violence against women. The award recognised her work which challenged social stigma and legally conservative policies in India . *In 2015 Rajitha was ranked 9th most influential emerging feminist by Elle Magazine's India edition. Her book 'KamaSutra: The Art of the Embrace' (published as "Sex, Culture and Modernity: India's Unique contributions to the global discourse" in India) has been extensively researched across continents, covering diverse communities. The book narrates the history of the most illustrative document on human sexual behaviour. *In 2016 Rajitha received the Aloka C. Inamdar Gender Award for her work in gender and sexuality studies from the Association of Women in Development, India . *In 2018 Rajitha published 'KamaSutra: The Art of the Embrace' in India through Penguin Random House. The book has been translated into Tamil by Jeyamohan and will be released soon . Rajitha has been a trustee of a UK charity that works with marginalised communities since 2011. She is a member of the editorial board for Development and Change, a leading sociology journal published by Wiley.
